An Order of Worship for

The Twenty-second Sunday after Pentecost 10.20.24



The word "Pentecost" is Greek for "fiftieth." Originally, Pentecost was an annual Jewish festival scheduled to take place 50 days after Passover. For Christians, however, Pentecost is the 50th day of the Easter season, which marks the new birth of the people of God. As recorded in Acts 2, the Holy Spirit descended to sanctify and empower the Church to continue the work of the ascended Christ in taking the gospel of the Kingdom to the ends of the earth. Pentecost Sunday is followed by the Season of Pentecost, which is also known as "Ordinary Time." During the Season of Pentecost, the focus of the Church Calendar shifts toward living ordinary yet Spirit-empowered lives in light of the death, resurrection, and ascension of Christ.
